The New Zealand contribution to Christian leaders in Asia-Pacific

Equipping emerging leaders

59 young students from impoverished backgrounds were sponsored with training at our Partner Schools through Leadership Development International.

10,090 preachers received free books in 2019 at Langham preaching seminars.

Multiplying the ministries of senior leaders

7 senior regional and national leaders were fully sponsored for masters or doctoral study through both Leadership Development International and Langham Scholars.

Mobilising for mission in Autearoa-New Zealand

LeaDev-Langham staff took up 50 preaching and speaking engagements and spent 11 days at Christian conferences and events telling the stories of leader developments in Asia-Pacific.

2 international partners were hosted in New Zealand, and 5 events were hosted by LeaDev-Langham to share the work of key leaders in Asia-Pacific.

Bridging the resource gap

3 Partner School campuses were upgraded, providing a more suitable learning environment for leaders in training.

Taking compassionate action

2 leaders and their ministries in Indonesia and Lebanon were supplied with relief aid. In Indonesia our funds went into tsunami relief while in Lebanon we helped fund ongoing support of Syrian refugees.

67 refugees were sponsored through trauma counselling, 220 refugees graduated from a vocational sewing school, and another 20 through vocational hair and beauty salon training, and 50 patients per week through dental and health care.

Making it happen

1,162 volunteer days were contributed by skilled Kiwis to facilitate the relationships with and organisational development of our Partner Schools. This is 27% up on last year, and we are so grateful to these wonderful people!

The contribution of our networks to Christian leaders in Asia-Pacific

OVERSEAS COUNCIL NETWORK

190 Partner Schools were supported.

235 students were sponsored for study.

40 faculty members were sponsored with higher degrees training.

4 libraries were built or equipped.

Overseas Council also has two national/regional strategies, alongside all the individual Partner School support being given: Pacific (involving 15 colleges), and Indonesia (involving a network of 50 colleges). Funding is applied to pedagogy training, conferences and consultancy.

Langham Preaching

Held **74** preaching training seminars in **16** preaching movements in **14** South Asia, East Asia and Pacific countries in need of solid biblical preaching. This included training to resource and develop local facilitators and preaching club coordinators through seminars and workshops.

Equipped 2,149 pastors and lay leaders to teach God's Word, through training led by 150 local facilitators, who are being equipped and working together in teams to train others, in 14 countries.

Shepherded 142 preaching groups of 7-10 pastors and leaders meeting regularly for ongoing training and mentoring.

Held 3 global or regional consultations or forums, involving 59 leaders and/or coordinators from across the world to review, learn, train and plan.

Langham Literature

Supplied **5,564** Bible-centred books to **212** colleges across **22** countries to help students grow and mature in Christ. **3,610** of these books were supplied to colleges free of charge.

Distributed 16,071 Bible-centred books to pastors, students and ministry partners in need of study materials.

2,154 of these books were supplied free of charge to participants at, or Coordinators of, Langham Preaching seminars.

7 local writers in 5 countries were supported through Writer Grants.

Supplied 1,665 Langham publications and published 47 books, 17 of which were authored by people from within the region.

Supported 8 indigenous publishers in 6 different countries through Publisher Grants.

Langham Scholars

Supported 29 students from 14 different countries in theological doctoral programs.

Supported 2 current doctoral scholars and 1 post-doctoral scholar, with study residences for concentrated periods of study, or research and writing projects, in centres where there is access to excellent library resources and a research community.

Supported the involvement of 3 post-doctoral scholars in the International Research and Training seminar research residency to assist them to produce papers, research articles and academic monographs.
