2021 was a challenging year as the COVID 19 started to spread rapidly in Sri Lanka. The desperation of the situation is seen in many ways, but a few must be highlighted. Our health minister was advocating a magic portion (known as *Dhammika pani*) introduced by the goddess *kali*, and almost the whole country was dragged into taking this magic portion by promoting through the public media. When the death toll was rising one Cabinet minister said “we believe in the vaccination and leave the rest to God” even though Sri Lanka is not a God-fearing nation. The president of the country was not willing to take the country into a lockdown. The public threatened the government that if the government does not go for a total lockdown people will go for a self-lockdown. On the 20th of August, the president of the country addressed the nation and he announced about the lockdown saying, if the country is going for a lockdown the people of both government and private sector will have to make a sacrifice. The implication of this statement was understood by people that they must donate part of their salary to the government to save the country from going into bankruptcy. In short these are few highlights of the crisis in Sri Lanka although the reality is even worse.

However, we believe in God of Purpose and Power. God is in control, and nothing happens without a purpose. No evil can overrule God's purposes. God is still on the Throne, and He will accomplish His purposes.

LBC-CGS building renovation is almost completed. We still have few renovations of the building and changing some of the old wall hangers, garden deco and furnishing of office and guest rooms.

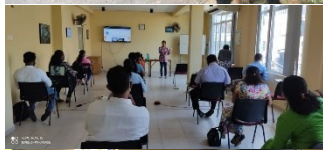
Constructions at LBCS-Peradeniya

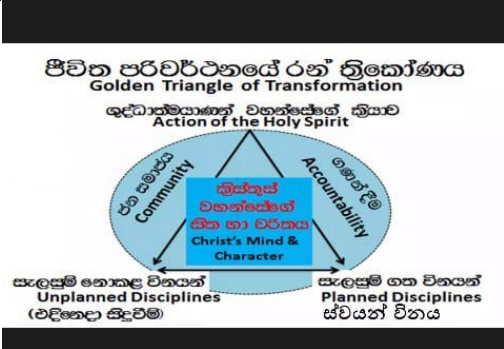
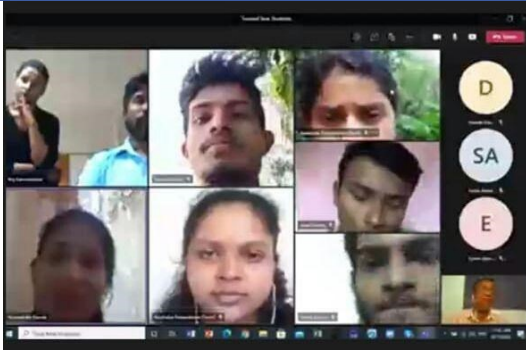

Spiritual Formation

We have a syllabus for the 1st year students and another syllabus for the 2nd and 3rd year students. Classes and prayer secessions are held via MS Teams every Friday from 7.30 am – 12.00 noon by the appointed teacher. All these students are also divided into smaller groups who meet every Wednesdays as growth groups. Their progress is monitored by the appointed growth group leader who in turn will report to LBCS staff about how these students develop their daily walk with the Lord. Their local pastors are also involved in monitoring the progress of students and these pastors report to the appointed staff of LBCS. They post their learning

activities on Moodle and we have three leaders working under the Teacher who does spiritual Formation. The Spiritual Formation program is run by Dr. Upul Nishantha Silva who serves as a senior pastor of a local church.

6. Christian Perspectives on Corruption and Integrity in Managing Resources

Challenges

Due to the economic crisis the whole country is facing, our students are struggling to pay course fees and we are trying to find the 1/3rd of support for them. LBCS is raising 2/3rd of scholarship from donors. Moreover, some students cannot afford to purchase an online learning device (minimum: a smart phone). Most of them borrow and use the phones of either their brother/sister or father after they return home at night after work. These are challenging times, and we hope to reopen the college for physical classes after completion of vaccination, because it is only then the government will reopen all other schools.

Please pray that we will be able to reopen our physical classes and other relevant activities as soon as possible. All our students are anticipating joining physical classes, because most of them are handicap without IT devices.
